A Message from Cherie... On a recent Sunday morning we had an exciting worship service filled with praise and celebrations, the sacrament of Baptism, and the sending forth of nineteen disciples in mission to the world. The theme for the service was The Great Commission (Matthew 28:19- 20) where Jesus met the disciples on a mountain in Galilee and said: **“Go . . . make disciples of all nations, baptizing them . . . and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age.”**

After opening the service with a hymn of praise, we baptized young Jacob Bradley McMakin and welcomed him as our newest little brother in Christ. **In doing so we are fulfilling the commission given us by our Lord to baptize!** We promised to love and care for him, to increase his faith, confirm his hope and perfect him in love. We do that by fulfilling our vows to participate with him in the ministries of the church by our prayers, our presence, our gifts, our service and our witness.

We then recognized and celebrated members of the church who had completed a year-long Disciple Bible Study. They joined the more than sixty-five other members of the Hillcrest congregation who have participated in one or more of the various Disciple Bible Studies. **By teaching the Word through Scripture study we are fulfilling the commission given us by our Lord to teach!** (Watch for information about the upcoming scripture studies that will begin in August and September of this year.)

During the Children's Time we received a recap of Vacation Bible School and we joined in with the children as they declared through a song that we all are C H R I S T I A N S and we have C H R I S T in our H E A R T S who will L O V E E T E R N A L L Y! **Through VBS we are teaching our children (as commissioned by our Lord) to love as Christ loves!**

After I preached a brief meditation, Chip Parsons shared with us the work of our connectional church with a report on the recently held Annual Conference during the Ministry Moment (see his report on page 4 in this newsletter). He noted that Conner Worden had given the devotional one morning of the conference, and that Bud Whipple was certified as a Lay Minister. Chip shared with us the challenge from Bishop Bill McAlilly to **Make Disciples – to Discover, Equip, Connect and Send them into the world just as Christ has commissioned and commanded us.**

We ended the service with words of commissioning and sending forth of 16 youth and adult leaders to Mt. Top for a week of home repair and VBS in Grundy County. We sent forth two to the Heart of Worship mission trip to Haiti and then we sent Connor Worden forth with our prayers and blessings as he left to go into the Air Force. **They all went following in the steps of Jesus' first disciples who were commissioned by Jesus to “Go into the world and make disciples!**

Christ our Lord invites us: **“Come and follow me.”** Christ our Lord commands us: **“Love the Lord; love your neighbor as you love yourself.”** Christ our Lord commissions us: **“Go into all the world so that all may know me.”** Christ our Lord promises us: **“Lo, I am with you always and forever.”**

As members of Hillcrest United Methodist Church and as disciples of our Lord Jesus Christ we have accepted the challenge set forth in Christ's invitation, commandment, commission and promise. What a privilege to serve among and with a congregation so committed to our Lord's Great Commission and to our Lord's commandments to love.

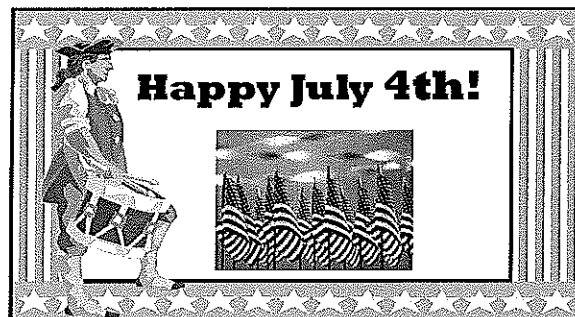

2014 Annual Conference Report

As Lay Leader (Chip Parsons), it is my honor and privilege, along with our pastor Rev. Cherie Parker, to represent Hillcrest United Methodist Church at **the 47th Tennessee Annual Conference**, which was held at Brentwood United Methodist Church from June 8th to 11th. Bud Whipple attended as a representative of the Nashville District.

The theme for this conference was **"Expecting Greater Things: Discover, Equip, Connect, Send."** Bishop Bill McAlilly presided over the conference, and in attendance were both Laity and Clergy from 680 churches of the Middle Tennessee area.

We had seven resolutions to vote upon, with five being approved and two being withdrawn to be resubmitted to the 2015 Annual Conference. The two being resubmitted were pertaining to a campaign to perform improvements to both Cedar Crest and Beersheba Springs camping and retreat facilities. We also approved changes to the Standing Rules and Policies along with approving **the conference budget for 2015: \$12,635,973. This represents a decrease from the 2014 budget.**

On Monday we had the opportunity of attending a Service of Celebration of Retirement. **Rev. Skip Armstead retired this year.** Cathy and Skip will be moving back to their Brentwood home and will remain active in ministry opportunities.

At the Memorial Service we remembered Christine Prichard, widow of the Reverend Robert Prichard and **mother of our own Kristie Ryan.**

We were present at: the commissioning of two Deaconesses; the ordination of 21 First time pastors; the commissioning of one provisional Deacon; the commissioning of five provisional Elders; the ordination of one Deacon; and the ordination of 10 Elders in full membership of the conference.

We also had the honor and privilege of being present at the commissioning of our very own **Mr. Bud Whipple as the newest "Certified Lay Minister"** of the Tennessee Conference.

As a service project, we packed 8 tons of rice and beans to be distributed to needy families in the Middle Tennessee conference area through the **"Feed America First"** organization. The food will be distributed to food banks throughout our conference. We were treated to a wonderful dinner of rice and beans for helping out, which turned out not bad; however, a little salt would have helped.

A major focus was on our **"Imagine no more Malaria"** campaign. The initial collections from both the Memphis and the Tennessee Conferences tallied up to just over \$78,000 toward the campaign goal of **raising \$1 million by the 2015 Annual Conference** to eradicate malaria in Africa. The main point of this campaign is that Malaria is Preventable, Treatable and Beatable.

One highlight that occurred at the conference was that the assembly was addressed by none other than our own **Connor Worden** during the morning devotional. Connor **spoke** of how growing up in the church and being active in the youth program has prepared him to face the challenges that the future holds for him. Connor was due to ship out to Air Force boot camp the next week. Needless to say, Connor did not get away from the podium without a standing ovation.

The four days were a great time to experience some wonderful teaching, reconnect with brothers and sisters in Christ who are active in ministry throughout the conference, and experience the business side of our denomination. 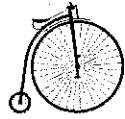

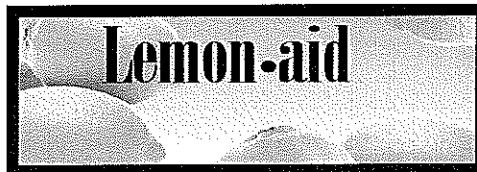

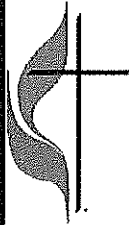
